

Ottawa Statement Regarding Bill C-36 Protection of Communities and Exploited Persons Act

Re: Bill C-36 Protection of Communities and Exploited Persons Act

We, the undersigned, are writing today to express our deep concern about the proposed passage of Bill C-36, the Protection of Communities and Exploited Persons Act. We represent a broad cross-section of organizations and individuals specializing in violence against women, community health, and services to vulnerable populations in the Ottawa area.

As a diverse group with autonomous mandates we hold a range of perspectives on how to address the balance of sex worker safety, community safety, and the protection of vulnerable persons. Our diversity of positions makes it all the more striking that we find ourselves unified in the position that Bill C-36 is fundamentally flawed and, as such, should not become the law in Canada.

Of particular concern is the failure of the Bill to address the Security of the Person issues raised by the recent Supreme Court rulingin *Canada* (*Attorney General*) v. *Bedford* 2013 SCC 72. Not only does Bill C-36 fail to alleviate the criminalization of women in sex work, we are concerned it may add new potential for harm and thereby exacerbate the precarious position of women socially, and under the law.

We urge the committee to act to ensure this proposed legislation does not pass into law in Canada without, at minimum, significant amendment informed by a wide range of testimony and evidence-based expert opinion. We particularly urge Parliamentarians to hear from sex workers and community-based women's advocates about the safety and criminalization consequences that Bill C-36 will provoke, should it pass in its current form.
